DUBLIN AIRPORT AND TRAVEL TO CITY CENTRE

Dublin Airport is located 10km north of the city centre and is served by most international airlines (full details are available at www.dublinairport.com).

bus services to the city centre

The airport is accessible by over 1,000 buses and coaches daily. From the airport, you can reach all areas in and around Dublin, as well as various towns and cities across Ireland.

To and From Dublin by Bus

Buses pick up passengers from outside the terminals. Passengers should follow the signs for the relevant zone from Terminal 1 or Terminal 2. The typical fare to the city centre is €6 to €10



Dublin Bus offers many routes throughout Dublin, including the AirLink express bus to Heuston and Connolly Rail Stations in the City Centre.

Airlink service will bring you direct from Dublin City Centre or Rail/Bus Stations to Dublin Airport

Aircoach offers services from Dublin Airport to the City Centre, on a 24 hours basis each day. The City Centre service stops at most of the major hotels.

From City Centre

Passengers arriving by taxi will be set down on the forecourt directly outside either Terminal 1 or Terminal 2.

From Dublin Airport

Taxis are available from the forecourts directly outside Terminal 1 and Terminal 2. Passengers should follow Taxi signage to the designated taxi ranks. A taxi dispatcher is available at either taxi rank if you require any further information.

FERRY PASSENGER TERMINAL

Dublin Ferry Terminal is located on the east side of the city and is not far from the city centre. Buses and taxis provide a regular service from the port to the city and beyond. Irish Ferries, P&O, Isle of Man and Stena Line, between them, operate a range of sailings daily connecting Dublin with the UK. There is a second ferry terminal on the south of the city at Dun Laoghaire. This terminal is connected to the city centre train stations by the DART urban rail system

CONFERENCE VENUE

One of DIT's most historic buildings, Bolton Street was specifically designed and built for technical and technological education in 1911, on the site of what was once the European Hotel. Since then and up to the present day, it has been a centre of leading edge technological and design education in the College of Engineering and Built Environment. Located in Dublin's north inner-city, Bolton Street is within minutes of shopping areas in Henry Street and Parnell Street, as well as the old city markets and the newly-refurbished Smithfield. Bolton Street and Linenhall, its sister building across the road, are home to students from engineering, design, apprentice and trade areas, architecture, and built environment.

hotel information and locations

These hotels listed above are within a 5 -7 minute walk of the conference venue at Dublin Institute of Technology, Bolton Street. There are other hotels guesthouses and hostels within a 10 minute walk of the conference venue. It may be possible to find hotels offering cheaper rates away from the city centre. Try to book hotels that or on the red or green luas tram routes which serve the city centre.

conference dinner venue

The Conference Dinner will be hosted at the Old Jameson Distillery on Bow Street at Smithfield. Jameson have been distilling whiskey at the site since 1780. By the turn of the 19th century, it was producing 1,000,000 gallons annually. Dublin at the time was the centre of world whiskey production. Jameson had by 1805 become the world's number one whiskey. Today, Jameson is the world's third largest single-distillery whiskey.

travel in and around dublin

Dublin city has an established transport system which is serviced by a bus system (Dublin Bus), and a tram system (LUAS). The closest tram stop to the conference venue is Jervis Street. There is a tram stop beside the conference dinner location in Smithfield. There is also a public bicycle system (Dublin Bikes). The centre of the city is very accessible by foot and for short journeys this is the most effective means of travelling round the city.

Wednesday, 4 September 2013


